The Planning Department, created a new, standalone land use category and ordinance which accommodates RV parks and campgrounds, furthermore, authorizing this use within the City's jurisdiction.

The Planning Board held the public meeting on April 23, 2024 and recommends Council approve the ordinance amendment.

- L. Approval of Fayetteville Road DOT URA – Holt Moore, City Attorney
EUD would like to formally bid out material for the Fayetteville Rd. NCDOT widening project U-5797. The total approximate cost of the materials for this project will be \$280,000 for material only. We would like to be able to formally bid out the labor for this project at an approximate cost of \$635,000 once the material arrives. We would also like to have the URA for project U-5797 signed and approved at a total cost of approximately \$905,000 which will cover the cost of material and labor for this project. All this cost will be reimbursed from NCDOT back to City of Lumberton when the project is complete. ***Due to unforeseen additional costs, this agreement is being amended to a figure of \$1,113,487.27. The new URA and new cost sheet are attached.***

O. Acceptance of Architect's Recommendation for Bid Award - Carolina Civic Center Annex – Brandon Love, Deputy City Manager

The existing Historic Carolina Civic Center in Lumberton, NC is expanding their footprint with an 8,200 square foot single story addition. The addition will include an enlarged lobby space to support the existing lobby space with concession area and ticket booth, a large 3,800 square foot ballroom, a warming kitchen, conference room, storage area, and restrooms. The original bid date for this project was scheduled for May 1st, 2024. The architect was unable to open bids on May 1st due to only receiving 2 out of 3 bids required.

On May 3rd, City staff advertised for rebid of the Civic Center Annex Project with a new bid date of May 29, 2024. The architect's certified bid tabulation, along with a recommendation of bid award will be presented at the June 3rd City Council Meeting.

It is recommended that City Council accept the architect's recommendation for bid award to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder.

Brandon Love, Deputy City Manager presented a certified bid tabulation sheet showing that there were three bids received. He stated that the lower bid was submitted by Dave's Construction Services, Inc. in the amount of Base Bid \$3,101,874; Alternate #1 \$8,947; Alternate #2 \$7,245. Maurer's evaluation of the experience, reputation, and financial condition of Dave's Construction Services indicates that they are capable of completing the scope of work as outlined in the bid documents. Therefore, we recommend the award of the bid for the Carolina Civic Center Addition to Dave's Construction Services, Inc. in the amount of \$3,118,066 including the Base Bid, Alternate #1, & Alternate #2.

Councilman Carroll asked if this would take up all the land we have there. DM Love stated yes.

The city only received one response to this RFQ, however because this will result in a professional services contract, less than three proposals is acceptable.

Staff recommends that City Council authorize a contract with BBG Real Estate Services for \$15/acre for raw land, \$5/per square foot for commercial buildings, and \$15/per acre for commercial land, with a minimum price of \$2,500/property, as indicated in their proposal dated May 21, 2024. The awarded NCLWF grant will reimburse the city for these appraisal services.
