H. CDBG Building Demolition Professional Service Agreement Adjustment – Rob Armstrong, Public Works Director

During the demolition of the First Street Manufacturing Facility and the Town Common Warehouse, multiple obstacles were encountered requiring additional engineering and project management interaction. These obstacles included the discovery and clean up management of previously unknown petroleum product near the above ground storage tank at the warehouse site and the discovery of asbestos flashing found underneath secondary roof material on north parapet of the industrial building. These items required additional immediate attention at the time of discovery and will require further administrative work during the CDBG closeout of the project. Public Works is requesting that the Professional Services Contract with the Wooten Company be adjusted in the amount of \$12, 874.75 to cover these expenses. Attached is a full summary of the additional services that have been provided and the services expected to be needed for closeout. The original contract was \$21,000. Under this CDBG program, administrative expenses are not reimbursable so Public Works is recommending these funds be taken from the Water and Sewer Capital Reserve Fund.

Public Works is requesting that the Professional Services Contract with the Wooten Company be adjusted in the amount of \$12, 874.75 with funds taken from the Water and Sewer Capital Reserve Fund.

L. Change Order of Flood Decontamination at EUD – Lamar Brayboy, Electric Utilities Director

The Electric Department is requesting a change order for the flood decontamination due to Hurricane Matthew at the EUD complex from EHC Environmental. The estimated amount of \$114,000 was approved at the November council meeting. The overage amount was \$15,000. The overage was due to delays with the fork lift which was damaged by the Hurricane and was to be provided by the city. EHC also encountered delays due to finding asbestos in the office and warehouse. EHC continued to be lower than the next bid by \$22,843.90.

- U. Authorize w Water Extension to Serve North Carolina Baptist Association (Avent Drive)
Waiver of Annexation Requirement – Rob Armstrong, Public Works Director

Public Works has received a request to extend domestic water and fire service to the warehouse acquired by the North Carolina Baptist Association on Avent Drive which is a private road off of Starlight Drive. This will be the headquarters for the volunteers that will help rebuild flood damaged structures within the City of Lumberton. The warehouse itself is not inside the City Limits but is adjacent to the City Limits bordering the airport property at the rear. Public Works intends to permit a 750 linear foot, 6" diameter water main extension, funded thru the water and sewer operations budget, to serve the facility. Section 23-60 of our ordinance requires properties adjacent to the city limits wishing to be served by City water or sewer to request voluntary annexation. Since the entity requesting service is a non-profit organization which does not pay property taxes.

Public Works is recommending Council waive the annexation requirement for this facility and allow Public Works to extend services.
